**Alderman:** The building that houses many of the highest-ranking campus administrators.

ALTC: Applied Learning and Teaching Community

AVC: Associate Vice Chancellor

**BA:** Business Affairs

**Blackboard (Bb) Learn:** Our learning management system (LMS) at UNCW. All courses are automatically populated in a Blackboard shell for your convenience. We are transitioning to another LMS, Canvas, in the next few semesters.

**BOG:** UNC System Board of Governors. Oversees all campuses of the UNC System. northcarolina.edu/apps/bog/members.htm

BOT: UNCW Board of Trustees. Sets some policies for UNCW and oversees certain operations. uncw.edu/bot

**CAIC:** Campus Activities and Involvement Center

**Canvas:** The learning management system (LMS) we will be using starting in 2019-20. Will be available during the 2018-19 academic year.

CAS: College of Arts and Sciences

**Centro Hispano:** Supports the rapidly growing number of Hispanic students applying, attending and completing degrees at UNCW.

**ETEAL:** Experiencing Transformative Education through Applied Learning, our Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) theme we have recently completed. This enormous, campus-wide effort has been a part of our accreditation process with our regional accrediting agency, SACS, and resulted in the formation of the Office of Applied Learning (OAL).

**Faculty Senate:** The faculty body that supports shared governance and has power to act for the faculty in matters of faculty concern.

**FERPA:** Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act regulates how students' personal educational records and other data must be managed and protected.

**GA:** Former (and still often heard) name for the UNC System General Administration, located in Chapel Hill, governs all campuses of the system. northcarolina.edu

**IRB:** Institutional Review Board; part of Research Compliance. **uncw.edu/research/compliance** 

**ITS:** Information Technology Services, part of Business Affairs that serves the entire university

LGBTQIA Resource Office: Supports lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning, intersex and allied students, faculty, staff and alumni.

LMS: Learning management system

**MARBIONC:** Marine Biotechnology in North Carolina works through the Center for Marine Science to complete research and development of marine products and technologies. **MySeaport:** A portal that gives faculty access to email, class rosters and photos, and access to other campus systems/tools.

**OAL:** Office of Applied Learning

**OIDI:** Office of Institutional Diversity and Inclusion

**OIP:** Office of International Programs

**OLLI:** Osher Lifelong Learning Institute, a university-led and member-supported organization that provides lifelong learning opportunities.

**OSLE:** Office of Student Leadership and Engagement

**OUR:** Office of University Relations

**PCJ:** Port City Java, a local coffee house chain, is in Randall Library and is a popular meeting spot for faculty, staff and students.

PI: Primary Investigator on a research project

PTR: Post-tenure review

QEP: Quality Enhancement Plan; see ETEAL

**RAMSeS:** The online approval system for sponsored research projects. You must go through RAMSeS at the proposal stage to ensure compliance. uncw.myresearchonline.org/ramses

**Reassignment:** Approved language in North Carolina for referring to work time devoted to research and released from other professional duties. We have no use of "sabbatical" here.

**RPT:** Reappointment, Promotion and Tenure. The name of both a process and the name of an elected faculty senate committee.

#### SA: Student Affairs

**SACS:** The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools is the regional body for the accreditation of degree-granting higher education institutions in the Southern states.

Seahawk Club: Athletic boosters who raise funds to support athletic scholarships and physical facilities.

SeaNet: UNCW's course registration system that provides access to students' degree audits and faculty's pay information and tax forms. SHAHS: School of Health and Allied Human Sciences

**SharePoint:** A collaboration software solution to assist faculty, staff and students with group communication.

**SLOs:** Student Learning Outcomes, the clearly stated and measurable goals you are required to include on every course syllabus. Need help with your SLOs? Your department is a great first resource, and CTE is always glad to help.

SON: School of Nursing

**SPARC:** Sponsored Programs and Research Compliance, the unit that assists with externally funded research and other programs.

**SWOOP:** Faculty and staff newsletter; check SWOOP regularly for announcements and opportunities.

SSW: School of Social Work

System: The UNC System offices in Chapel Hill, overseeing all System institutions in the state. Sometimes referred to by its previous moniker, the GA, or General Administration. northcarolina.edu

**TAC:** Technology Assistance Center; located on the first floor of Randall Library

UGS: Undergraduate Studies

ULC: University Learning Center

**UNI 101:** The First-Year Seminar (FYS) designed to support new students as they integrate into UNCW and into the college experience.

**University College:** Ensures that students make a successful transition to UNCW, retain good academic standing, and identify and declare an appropriate major.

**US:** University Studies
